*There are far too many children in the state of Connecticut who have been abused, neglected or abandoned. They cannot feel safe in their own homes. Fortunately, Community Health Resources' Safe Home program is available to help local children in need regain the joys of childhood.*



- Safe Home is a residential program, located in Enfield that cares for Connecticut children aged 3-12 who have been removed from their families by the Department of Children and Families due to neglect, emotional abuse, physical abuse and/or sexual abuse.
- Safe Home provides a temporary, nurturing home environment for children who have lived in chaotic and disrupted family situations. The dedicated and caring Safe Home staff works one-on-one with each child to stabilize their trauma and to find the best 'permanent' child placement in foster care. Safe Home offers its children an opportunity for a healthy, happy future and success in their schools, their social pursuits and within their new families.
- CHR's Safe Home is the only one of its kind in the area that will accept children who have sustained the greatest emotional traumas. Consequently, CHR's state funding contract falls short of the program's operational expenses. To maintain the high quality of care that the children living at Safe Home deserve, Community Health Resources relies upon surrounding communities and generous individuals for financial support.
