

LGBTQ+ Pride Month is celebrated every year in the United States in June to commemorate the 1969 Stonewall Uprising in Manhattan. A year later, pioneering bisexual activist Brenda Howard organized Gay Pride Week and the Christopher Street Liberation Day Parade, which is now known as the New York City Pride March and has since acted as a catalyst for other parades and marches. Today, during the month of June, pride events are held throughout the United States to recognize the impact LGBTQ+ people have had in the United States and throughout the world. This year, the Human Rights Campaign recognizes the importance of continuing to fight for the community's freedom, liberation, joy, and pride #WithoutException.
