



On Friday, October 14, Leading Culture Solutions will host a Community Conversation on Cultural Appropriation.

For background, <u>culture</u> refers to "the traditions, customs, beliefs, and practices of any given ethnic, racial, or religious group. Key elements of culture include: language; art, music, and literature; clothing, social norms, customs, and values; history and government and religion and holidays." Cultural appropriation occurs when members of a majority group use or adopt cultural elements of minority groups in a stereotypical, disrespectful or exploitative way. In addition to stereotyping, disrespecting or exploiting the culture, those who appropriate tend to ignore important cultural

contexts and only pick and choose the parts of the culture they consider to be appealing.

Some examples of cultural appropriation include:

- Wearing a <u>headdress</u>, <u>Kimono</u> (without cultural understanding or appreciation) or <u>blackface</u>
- When the name and/or mascot of sports teams are titles of Native American tribes or symbols
- · Using sacred symbols for non-spiritual reasons
- · Chopsticks in hair as a celebration of Asian Culture
- · Themed parties that exoticize other cultures
- "Borrowing" hairstyles of other cultures
