#### **April Diversity Holidays and Observances**



Each year, Arab American culture, heritage, and contributions are celebrated throughout the month of April. However, April wasn't nationally recognized as Arab American Heritage Month until this year. On March 31, 2023, President Biden issued a <u>Presidential Proclamation</u> officially dedicating the month to celebrating and honoring Arab Americans.

Arab immigrants began entering the United States in the 1800s, and by the 1960s, an estimated 15,000 were migrating to the United States each year. According to the **Arab American Institute**, approximately 3.7 million Arab Americans live in the United States today, a majority of which have ancestral ties to Lebanon, Syria, Palestine, Egypt, and Iraq. In an effort to recognize the Arab American population, in 2017, the <u>Arab America Foundation</u> launched the National Arab American Heritage Month initiative, which gained recognition in 45 states between 2017 to 2022, but was officially recognized nationally this year.
